What do we do when the Lord does not cure our loved ones?

There is no simple answer to that question as St. Paul says, "We walk by faith and not by sight" (2 Cor. 5:6-10). And when we walk by faith, we walk with the Lord Jesus and his Mother Mary and all of our spiritual family and friends. With our whole faith-life, we need to accept that all of life is a learning process. St. Julian of Norwhich teaches me that truth everyday of my life; "all will be well again; all will be well again".

This wellness in faith means that we will be well in the Lord. As a student learning pastoral education with other hospital chaplains, my supervisor taught me a special "learning" years ago. There are three miracles from God that we need to pray for and accept. The first miracle of life is to pray for God's healing strength and miracle of life, remission or the cure. The second miracle of life is to pray for God's hope in our Christian lifestyle. To scratch the surface of any evil situation in order to find hope and a good news message of positive living in God's love is the second miracle that we pray for. The third miracle of life is what God gave to His only begotten Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, life after death, the resurrection into God's Heavenly home. We need to pray for all three miracles of life, together and not to stop at the first miracle of life.



Elizabeth Kubler-Ross wrote about the stages of the grieving process. Those stages that we all experience when we experience any great loss or great disappointment are denial, anger, bargaining, depression and acceptance. We need to reach acceptance with the help and support of God ans others, either professionally or in a support group, who are experiencing the same process of grief. We need to move through each stage and not to stop until we get to our goal of acceptance. Blessed Mother Mary did her "Via Matris" through her way of the cross with blindfaith in following Jesus; and so must we do it also.

As we were conceived on a special day, we will all die to this earthly life on a special day. Our goal is to get back home to God, the Source of All of our lives and love. And that special nature of


